### Section 4. First Aid Measures

#### **Description of Necessary First Aid Measures**

**General Advice:** Move out of dangerous area. Consult a physician. Show this safety data sheet

**Eye Contact:** Immediately flush eyes with plenty of water, occasionally lifting the upper and

lower eyelids. Check for and remove any contact lenses. Continue rinsing. Get
